Reports are that Chris is fine but the hot humid conditions took their toll on many runners in both the junior and senior races, including multiple world champion Kenenisa Bekele who also failed to complete the course. Chris had finished the 1st of 4 laps in 79th position out of 126 starters. He was 68th at half way and although he does not remember finishing the third lap, he had moved up to 59th position after 3 laps and looked set for a good result.
