

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It was another big year for the club with many great events and performances over the past year. On the international scene, club life member Steve Hooker overcame injury to win the world title clearing 5.90m in the Berlin Olympic Stadium in dramatic circumstances. After injuring himself only 12 days prior to the final in what was diagnosed as a grade one adductor tear typically requiring a 21 day recovery period, Steve assisted by intensive medical treatment followed a high risk strategy which saw him vault only once in qualifying and twice in the final. A near miss in the final at 5.85m was followed by a successful clearance at 5.90m, which proved enough as all his rivals failed to clear at this height, thereby declaring Steve the World Champion. At the same championships marathon runner Andrew Letherby ran 2:17.29 in trying conditions for a very creditable 30th place in the World Champs marathon. While we don't get to see Andrew compete in person due to being based in Boulder Colorado, we are still pleased to see his great performances at an elite level via satellite!

Steve Hooker reassured us of no long term injury damage to his adductor by following up with an impressive performance at the World Indoor Championships at Doha, Qatar in March this year. Steve secured the gold medal with a vault of 6.01m, a championship record. This gives Steve a full suite of titles being the reigning Commonwealth, Olympic, World and World Indoor champion in the men's pole vault. Who could have known when Mark Stewart first started coaching Steve in 1997, what a legacy of achievement they would create.

At a junior level Brodie Cross has been selected to represent Australia in the pole vault at the inaugural Youth Olympic Games in Singapore in August. The all-new Youth Olympic Games aims to inspire youth around the world to embrace, embody and express the Olympic values of excellence, friendship and respect and will see some 5,000 athletes aged between 14 and 18 years compete in 26 sports across 12 days of international action. Good luck Brodie as you take on the world's best youth athletes.

In other international competition Rebecca Marchant cleared 3.80m to finish 3rd in an international field in the 2010 Chinese Taipei International Pole Vault Championship on 23 March. Nikki Chapple won the Marugame half marathon in Japan on Sunday in a time of 68:37. This time is a PB by nearly 90 seconds and would have ranked Nikki 15th in the world for 2009. This complemented her win against an international field at the Great Australian Run over 15km. After very promising junior career and a subsequent stint at the University of Iowa, it is great to see Nikki performing at such a high level after a period away from the sport.

Andrew White ran Lake Kawaguchi marathon in Japan and despite some injury problems Andrew still finished 16th in the very respectable time of 2:35:23 in his debut marathon. We hope this experience will build for greater opportunities in this event in the future for Andrew.

June Petrie on October 31st finished 4th in the world 50km road championships in Gibraltar. June completed the tough course in 3:44:45 to set a new age group (45-49) Australian record. June also finished 21st in the Commonwealth Mountain Running Championships in Keswick, England despite running with a cast on her broken wrist! Also in England in a battle of the ashes Joel Pocklington and James Filshie finished 2nd and 4th respectively in the pole vault and Nikki Chapple finished 3rd in the women's 2 mile event and then ran in the Great City Games the next day to finish 4th.

At the World Masters Indoor Championships, Box Hill had two athletes travel to Kamloops in Canada to take part in this event. Andrew Wilcox won a bronze medal in the 200m and finished in 4th position in the 400m, then won a silver medal in the 4x200m relay. Colin Pocklington made the final of the 50+ years 60m event, and finished in 7th place and also made the semi-finals in the 200m and then won a bronze medal in the 4x200m relay.

Hanny Allston translated some great form in cross country events by competing in the world orienteering championships in Miskolc in Hungary with the Australian women's team.

Back on a domestic level at the Athletics Victoria Shield Finals, Box Hill finished the 2009/2010 shield competition season as runners up in both the men's division 1 and the women's division 1 competition. Unfortunately we were not able to add to our eight years in a row as the Men's premier club in summer competition which was an incredible achievement in itself. Our under 18 boys finished third and a depleted women's under 18 team finished fifth in the association finals at Doncaster on February 13.

Box Hill won both the men's and women's division 1 premierships at the East Region Shield finals. Despite not winning a summer competition association premiership for the first time in many, many years 2009/10 has been a successful season for Box Hill. It has seen an increase in the number of club members to 214 reversing a declining trend over previous years and good performances by most of our teams. Hopefully we can improve further next year and come away with the premierships.

At the Australian Championships Blake Lucas who won a silver medal behind Steve Hooker in the pole vault in Perth, with a jump of 5.05m. James Filshie also cleared 5.05m to take the bronze medal based on a count back. Blake continued to vault at a very high level by achieving a Commonwealth Games B qualifier of 5.45m at a Rare Air club meet in February.

A young emerging star is 14 year old Paris McCathrion who cleared 3.60m to finish 10th in the women's event at the nationals and has set a very high standard with her record breaking efforts at junior level in clearing 3.90m to break the Victorian under 15 and under 16 records during the season.

In the Victorian championships Blake Lucas (men's pole vault) and Paris McCathrion (women's pole vault) and our under 20 girls who won the 4x800m title (Amy Carrig, Ollie Turnbull, Nat Ambrose and Liselle Atkin) won titles. Congratulations also to Daniel Clark who won the state 1 mile championship in very tactical race with a time of 4:17.

In the Vic Masters championships held at Glenhuntly the club compiled 18 1st places, three 2nd places, four 3rd place and records were set by Andrew Wilcox 1st 60m 7.50 Vic Record 40-44 years and Rob Barclay 1st, Pole Vault 2.90m Vic Record in an age group slightly older than Andrew!

Some other notable performances included: Hanny Allston who travelled to Sydney to take part in the NSW 5000m championships. Hanny won the event in wet conditions by almost a minute in the time of 16:29. This follows on from her PB of 9:17 for 3000m in Launceston and a win in the half marathon in 75:03 in October. At the Milers Club on Feb 23 Julie Norney set a Vic 3000m record W40-44 in 10:25.6.

In the underage, relay and multi event championships Box Hill had many outstanding performers at Olympic Park in late February. Jesse Spry won a bronze medal in the state decathlon championship, scoring 6106 points, while Russell Clowes finished in 4th place scoring 5778. Our men's 4x200m relay team had a brilliant win, with Cameron Sherry, Braeden Cross, Lane Harrison and Mohamad Zeed picking up a gold medal. Matt Coloe, Sam Dipnall, Daniel Balassone and Andrew Nagle won silver in the 4x800m, while the teams of Matt Coloe, Sam Dipnall, Andrew Nagle and John Morris in the 4x1500m and Cameron Sherry, Mohamad Zeed, Cameron Baker and Andrew Wilcox in the 4x100m both won bronze medals. In the women's relays Kate Ackland, Julie Norney, Rachel Johnson and Helen McRae won a silver medal in the 4x1500m.

Many of our junior athletes won medals and put in great performances in the Victorian underage championships at Olympic Park. Special mention to our state champions, Tom Address:

Box Hill won the men's division 1 winter premiership for the second consecutive year after an exciting victory in the Tan relays. Our division 1 women's team just missed out, finishing 2nd on the ladder after an exciting tussle with Knox throughout the year. This is a great achievement by the club, to go so close to winning both the men's and women's distance running premierships. Box Hill also won the women's division 3 and the men's division 7 premierships.

All of our athletes deserve congratulations for the effort they have put in throughout the year. The renaissance of our winter teams is a tribute to the tireless work of the winter competition committee of Graeme Olden, Chris O'Connor, Ian and Megan Sloane. Outlining the depth of our winter results was the win in the clubs team event at the National Cross country in Nowra NSW with Chris Hamer finishing 4th and Steve Kelly 6th at this event.

Many thanks to the summer competition team managers Rob Falkenberg, Cathy Tilley and Elissa Ward for their assistance and encouragement to the athletes throughout the year, which is a large part of the reason why our teams continue to enjoy success. During the summer season Rob Falkenberg informed the club that after 17 years of service he was planning to conclude his role as a team manager at the end of the current season. The passion Rob brings to athletics and his support and encouragement of athletes at all levels of competition will be sadly missed by our athletes.

It was also a year in which we sadly lost our junior team manager David Boyd who passed away at the far too young age of 49. The tragic loss of David has shocked us all and the club committee intends to create a memorial at Hagenauer's Reserve in his memory. We were also saddened to learn of the passing of Alison Jones, wife of life member and AV Board member lan Jones.

Following a serious incident at the Aberfeldie venue during the summer season, Athletics Victoria reviewed all hammer cage facilities across Victoria and assessed our cage to not meet the high technical IAAF standard requirements and as a result our committee had no choice but to close it from further use. With quotes for a complying replacement nearing \$70,000, there is little immediate prospect of hosting hammer throw competition until we can raise significant capital funds and pay down our existing debt incurred in redeveloping the track.

The annual Trivia Night continues to be a great success with the latest event held at a new venue at Chatham Primary School and helping to raise in excess of \$5,000. Many thanks to Leana and her team of volunteers who assisted in making this night such a great success. In addition to her coaching at the club, Leana Joyce has been a driving force behind many new innovations at the club and an effective co-ordinator of our many volunteers, ably supported by Cameron Joyce.

Vivienne Lee concluded her role as club registrar and was recognised with an outstanding clubman award for her very efficient management of our registration processes over several years. We welcome Nicole Clowes into the role and thank Angela Robbie for supporting the role in making this transition.

Another successful financial result is in no small part due to the efforts of Angela Robbie. Her effective management of club finances enabled a significant reduction in our loan for the track redevelopment and places us well to meet many of the upcoming financial challenges that await us in the future in maintaining a facility at competition standard.

Graeme Olden, while aiming to reduce his commitment after many years of invaluable service to the club, maintained a strong role in the success of winter teams, set-up and pack up for Address:

TREASURER'S REPORT

This financial year has seen an excellent result with a net surplus of \$38,565.08. This has been achieved by:

- ensuring all athletes pay membership fees or training fees
- an increase in ground hire income
- an increase in donations and
- well supported fund raising activities.

Approximately \$10,800.00 was spent on equipment which included the purchase of new hurdles, pole vault fencing and other minor items. As well as the outlay on equipment it was pleasing to note that despite interest payments of nearly \$8,000.00 a further \$14,000.00 was paid off the loan.

Membership payments increased slightly however it is important that all efforts are made to recruit new members to the Club each year. The ground hire income increased by \$10,000.00 and whilst some of this increase was due to late payments in the last financial year it could be an indication that the resurfacing of the track has been attractive to both past and new hirers therefore increasing the ground hire.

Many donations were made direct to the Club or through the Australian Sports Foundation and I thank all members who contributed in this way.

Approximately \$8,200.00 was raised through fundraising activities which included the Trivia night, sale of chocolates/snakes, pens, memorabilia and Melbourne Track Classic tickets. The fund raising activities were a huge success and the funds raised will go towards equipment, seating and further development of the track. Thanks to all members who organised and helped with fundraising.

This year it was great to have some new committee members with new ideas and I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their support and hard work during the season. It is necessary for each committee member to take on a specific role and to recruit more committee members so that the workload can be distributed evenly.

This led to many athletes having to compete above their normal division which really hurt our division 2 and division 3 prospects. At the end of the home and away rounds our division 1 team only finished 3rd on the ladder and our division 2 and 3 teams were never in the finals hunt at all.

The 2009/2010 Shield season did not give the club the ultimate result that we were chasing. Despite a well fought win in the venue final we were not able to repeat the result a week later and finally went down in a tight contest to Glenhuntly. Finally our unbeaten Division 1 finals run since Shield competition started some 8 years ago came to an end. Our finals campaign was hindered by losing several top line athletes to various interstate competitions at the time, most notably the Briggs classic in Hobart the night before the Shield final. However I can't praise enough the efforts of all the competitors both junior and senior that represented the BHAC during the Shield final. As can sometimes be the case the loss of automatic senior team members opens opportunities for the next group of athletes to show their wares in competition. This helped produce some unexpected winners, most notably Sam Dipnall's win in the 5000m Shield final. This was a classic encounter from a bygone era with a Box Hill - Glenhuntly fight for the win. Sam prevailed with a performance that he will remember for a long time to come. The injured Jesse Spry's heroic efforts in the High Jump could not go without recognition. Jesse jumped right to the end with the "encouraging" words of yours truly ringing in is ears "I don't care if your foot breaks, you keep going and try to win". He did a marvellous jump ultimately coming second but reminding many of us older members of many past premiership days when all personal care was put aside in an effort to keep our record intact.

I couldn't have asked for any more than what the athletes delivered on the day.
