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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As we come to the close of another year, it feels like the finish of a race with everyone rushing towards the finish line and giving their best efforts to complete the event. The 2010-11 season has been another busy year in the life of the Box Hill Athletic Club.

International representatives always catch our attention and in the past year we were very pleased to have Brodie Cross and Paris McCathrion, two outstanding young pole vaulters represent Australia internationally. Brodie competed in the 2010 Singapore youth Olympic Games and more recently at the 2011 IAAF World Youth Championships in Lille, France with a best clearance of 4.80m in the final. Paris joined Brodie in France to achieve a best clearance of 3.90m, both finished 9th in their respective finals.

Nikki Chapple continued her international career at the 19th world half marathon championships in Nanning China, where she achieved a 12th position in 1.11.25 to lead home an Australian women's team which narrowly missed a podium place in fourth position. Blake Lucas also took the opportunity to take on international competition, participating in the Australian team against England at the Great North City Games in September 2010.

In the Athletics Victoria Shield final held at Knox Park Reserve in February our women's division 1 team was victorious with a clear win over Glenhuntly in second place and Geelong in third. This was the first victory at this level since 2001 and the fourteenth premiership in women's summer competition at the highest level in Victoria in the history of the club. Our men's division 1 team finished third behind St.Kevins and Glenhuntly, despite its depth being depleted by injuries and our under 16 boys were narrowly beaten into third place on the day by Casey Cardinia in a creditable performance.

Joel Pocklington found good form at the right time winning the gold medal at the Australian Championships in the men's pole vault and Rebecca Marchant won silver in the women's pole vault. The national junior championships showed great depth of performances with 8 gold, 5 silver and 3 bronze medals.

The Athletics Victoria championships produced gold medal performances by Daniel Clark(1500m), James Filshie(Pole Vault) and Paris McCathrion. Joel Pocklington secured a silver medal and bronze medals were received by Julie Norney (3000m steeplechase)and Brodie Cross. The junior titles produced a large number of medallists with club members receiving 10 gold, 14 silver and 10 bronze medals. In the Vic Masters championships Box Hill athletes returned with 21 Gold Medals and 4 Silver.

Participation levels were strong over the XCR10 winter season with the club fielding many teams. The women's division one team recorded some great results over the season to finish in second position and will be keen to build on their good results for the XCR11 season. A third consecutive winter title eluded the men's division one team as they finished overall in third place. Good results were also recorded by the women's under 20 and over 40 finishing the season in second and third places respectively. The co-ordination and support of these teams are well managed by Ian and Megan Sloane, Chris O'Connor and Graeme Olden.

Summer competition team managers are an essential part of weekly competition. Cathy Tilley and Elissa Ward have assisted women's teams for many years and Heather Coughlin with tuition from Chris O'Connor ably managed the men's summer teams.

The annual Trivia Night continues to be a great success raising \$4,800 last year. Chris O'Connor's questions continue to confound the trivia buffs and Leana Joyce's co-ordination makes the night come together very successfully as our key fundraising event each year.

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The role of registrar may be one of those behind the scenes roles, but is vitally important in getting our athletes registered in an efficient manner ready for competition. This year Nicole Clowes performed the role and we are grateful for her assistance.

The clubs finances continue to be successful under the guidance of Angela Robbie with our loan balance substantially reduced, while still having sufficient funds for many other facility improvements during the year. Graeme Olden played many roles and deals with a range of issues at a committee level while maintaining his training and competition participation, despite significant work commitments.

Barbara Johnson played a vital role in keeping the committee organised this year, making sure our events ran to plan and liaising with the City of Whitehorse on a wide range of issues.

In addition to all his previous mentions, Chris O'Connor keeps everyone well informed through regular communications. Tony Marsh continued to build relationships with schools and other hirers and fielded many enquiries as ground manager and showed his versatility as MC at our presentation night. Sarah Hewitt took on the role of venue delegate communicating key issues and advocating on behalf of the club in this forum.

Bill Dyer took a lead role in dealing with maintenance issues and both Talitha Crawford and David Stevens have been a welcome addition to committee with new ideas and helping with a range of tasks. The professional skills of Rob Cornelius have changed the look of our newsletters and we were fortunate that Rob continues to provide support in this area after stepping down from his committee role.

This year marks the conclusion of 5 year strategic plan first set in 2006. The targets set in the membership/social category have proved beyond our reach with the number of registered athletes remaining stable at 212, some distance below our target of 250. Retention has been an ongoing Achilles heel with a decline from 68% to 59% this year. While injuries, travel plans, work and study commitments and the occasional retirement all effect this figure, a higher retention figure will be paramount to increasing our membership base.

The depth of coaching at the club remains a strength in attracting athletes and we hope that the investment in our facilities, makes Hagenauers Reserve a location that continues to serve coaches well.

With the increasing popularity and scheduling of specialist event meets (Milers club, Rare Air, High Velocity and Throwers meets) as a strategy by Athletics Victoria, Box Hill is hosting a greater number of AV competitions. Other competition measures are favourable with numerous international representatives and a successful women's division one team, although our total number of successful teams was down on previous years.

The fit out of the upstairs clubrooms remain incomplete, however there was progress this year with the installation of heating and cooling. Future plans for floor coverings, plumbing and a serving area will help us realise the dream of a social environment where club members can come and feel part of the club.

Financial measures remain strong with Ground Hire exceeding last year and our target. We continued with the discipline of a capital expenditure and maintenance plan. Major investments included the installation of new seating in the grandstand, the purchase of competition hurdles and trolleys, storage boxes for throws equipment and Olympic lifting bars for the gymnasium. Fundraising was slightly below target, but benefited from takings at several BBQ's held at Milers club and High Velocity meets as well as at Bunnings in Middlesborough Rd.

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In my final year as club president, I would like to thank the many club members and committee that have provided support over the past four years and encourage those with a passion for Athletics to take action and take on a role to enable the club to realise its full potential.

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TREASURER'S REPORT

This financial year has achieved a net surplus of \$22,632.66. Whilst this is well down on last year's net surplus it is still a good result. The reduced surplus is due to a reduction in donations and the increased expenditure on equipment, repairs, maintenance and repayment of the loan.

A large amount was spent on equipment and maintenance the main outlays being \$9,685.40 for new seating in the grandstand and \$4,695.24 for the purchase of another 20 hurdles. All purchases, repairs and maintenance are for the enjoyment and benefit of members. It is also very pleasing to note that the Bank loan has reduced dramatically with approximately \$30,000.00 being repaid during the year.

Membership payments increased slightly however it is important that all efforts are made to recruit new members to the Club each year. The ground hire income has continued to increase and as this is the Club's main source of revenue efforts should be made to attract new hirers and ensure current hirers are happy with the service provided and the standard of the ground.

The BHAC in conjunction with BHLAC operated the canteen with the help of a Canteen Manager and this proved profitable with approximately \$8,000.00 being raised.

Many donations were made direct to the Club or through the Barlow Fund and I thank all those that contributed in this way. Donations made to the Australian Sports Foundation have not yet been granted.

Approximately \$9,000.00 was raised through fundraising activities which included the Trivia night, lolly drive, movie night, the Bunnings BBQ and BBQ's at Miler and High Velocity meets. The fund raising activities were a huge success and the funds raised have been spent on equipment, seating and further development of the track. Thanks to all members who chipped in and helped with fundraising activities.

This year it was great to have some new committee members with new ideas and I would like to thank all members of the Committee for their support and hard work during the season. It is necessary for each committee member to take on a specific role and to recruit more committee members so that the workload can be distributed evenly.

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Summer Report 2010/2011 Track and Field Season

SHIELD COMPETITION

Box Hill had teams competing in men's and women's Division 1 competition as well as men's and women's Under 18, Under 16 and men's 40+ age groups. We had a successful season with all our teams finishing in the top four on the ladder in the Eastern Region. Men's and Women's Division 1 and men's under 16 teams qualified for the Association Finals.

The highlight of the season was an emphatic victory win by our Division 1 women's team in the Association finals. This is our first Division 1 women's premiership since 2001 and it was a great team effort. Congratulations to our finals team: Simone Carre, Bridget Aughton, Talitha Crawford, Sarah Hewitt, Kate McCowan, Abbie Freestone, Hannah Deal, Hayley Tomlinson, Laura Constable, Amy Carrig, Katherine Houston, Angela Phillips, Julie Norney, Charmaine McNally and Emily De Luca and to all the women who competed throughout the season to get our team to the finals.

Our men's Division 1 team struggled in the Association finals with the unavailability of a number of our best athletes through injury but put in a good performance to challenge for the premiership, only to fall behind at the end of the day and finish in 3rd position. Our Boys under 16 team performed very creditably and finished 4th just a few points out of 3rd place.

STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

There were a number of outstanding performances by Box Hill athletes at the Victorian Championships. Special mention to our pole vaulters who dominated the competition. Box Hill athletes swept the medals in the men's competition with James Filshie winning the gold on a count back from Joel Pocklington and Brodie Cross equalling Steve Hooker's state U18 record taking the bronze. Paris McCathrion cleared 3.90m to win her second women's open title at the age of just 15. Other outstanding performances included a gold medal winning performance by Daniel Clark in the men's 1500m championship in which he produced a brilliant last 200m and a bronze medal performance by Julie Norney in just her 3rd race over the steeple.

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2010 Winter Season (XCR'10)

Unfortunately Box Hill had several of its best distance runners unavailable for the 2010 winter season. This meant that runners from lower divisions had to move up to fill the team and it affected our performance throughout all divisions of competition. So 2010 was not as successful as previous seasons, with Box Hill failing to win a team premiership, although we finished 2nd or 3rd in a number of divisions. There were, however, several outstanding individual performances. Most notably Steve Kelly won the state cross country championships and went on to finish 4th in the national cross country championships. Steve was named the 2010 Victorian winter season men's open champion athlete for his performance across all the winter events. Julie Norney also had a great season and won the women's over 40 winter champion athlete award. Brooke Condon's performances improved dramatically throughout the year, winning a bronze medal in the state 15km road championships and finishing 7th in the national cross country title. Amongst our juniors, the most outstanding result was a gold medal performance by Kyle Martin-Alcaide in the state all schools cross country championship.

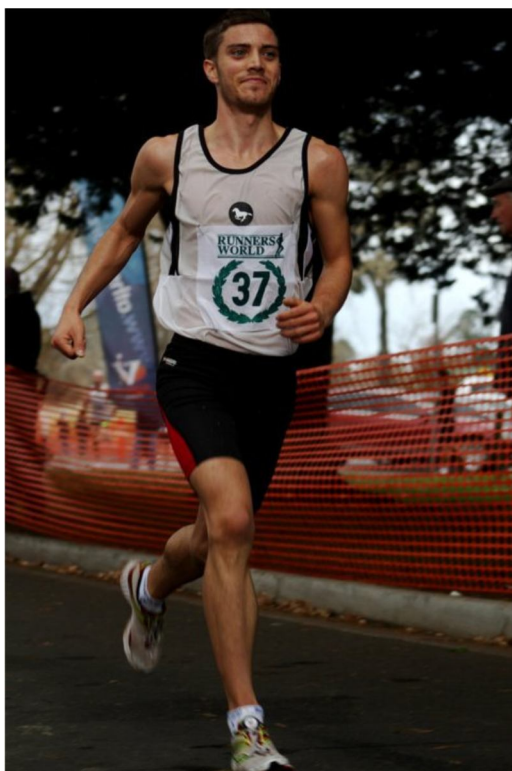
