A number of Box Hill athletes put in outstanding performances at the Victorian All Schools Championships at the weekend. As results are listed under the athletes school (rather than club) we have probably missed some results but special mention must be made of three athletes. Kyle Martin-Alciade put in a wonderful performance to win 3 gold medals, in the under 15 800m, 1500m and 3000m. Bridget Aughton won 2 gold medals, winning the under 18 100m Hurdles and 400m Hurdles and Rebecca Marchant won the under 16 Pole Vault and High Jump, broke a Victorian and Box Hill open club record while finishing 2nd in the triple jump and also came 4th in the long jump.
