JULIUS "JUDY" PATCHING

Many of our older members would know of Judy Patching who was involved with Athletics Victoria and the Australian Olympic movement since 1932, He was the chief starter at the 1956 Olympics and the Chef-de-mission at both the 1968 Summer Olympics in Mexico City and 1972 Summer Olympics in Munich. He passed away on Saturday, aged 82.
