



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2015/16 athletic year has been another successful one for the Box Hill Athletic Club.

We won the prestigious men's Open Division 1 track and field shield premiership and went agonizingly close to winning the women's Open Division 1 title as well. Seven of our eight teams qualified for the Athletics Victoria Shield finals, with our men's Open Division 1 and women's over 40 teams winning premierships and our women's Open Division 1, men's over 40 and men's under 18 teams finishing second.

In the winter cross country and road racing competition (XCR'15), Box Hill won the premiership in the men's over 50 division and finished second in the men's premier division.

Many Box Hill athletes put in outstanding individual performances, of special note are our state open champions Mohamad Zeed, David Grant, Phillipa Hajdasz and Flavien Basson and also Courtney Powell who defended her national cross country title. We have also had four of our members, Nana Owusu-Afryie, Kathryn Brooks, Georgia Hansen and Sarah Billings, selected to represent Australia at the World Under 20 Championships in Bydgoszcz, Poland in July 2016.

Almost as pleasing as the on track success, was an increase in the Club's membership, up to 255 members, plus a number of alternate claim members who ran for Box Hill in either the winter or summer seasons. This increase in membership must in some part be due to the fantastic and tireless work of our coaches, who are the backbone of any successful athletics club.

We have also been lucky to welcome to Box Hill former members of the Ruyton Athletics Club. I would like to extend a special welcome to those athletes from Ruyton who have joined the Club and I hope that they have found their first year with Box Hill enjoyable and successful.

The Club has also continued its good relationship with the Box Hill Little Athletics Centre and we have had an increasing number of dual claim members competing for the Club.

Special thanks should be extended to Alan Bertacco and the Box Hill Athletic Centre Management Committee, who have worked cooperatively with the Box Hill Athletic Club and the Box Hill Little Athletics Centre to manage our facility here at Hagenauer Reserve and to coordinate capital works. In particular, our new throwing cage is now operational and the new equipment shed is under construction.

The Club's off track activities are based around four events. The Club 5km handicap event that launches the winter season, the Club Trivia Night, held later in the winter, the track and field season launch and the presentation night at the conclusion of each athletic year. All of these activities have been successful and we hope that participation and attendance will continue to grow for each of these events. The other fundraising event this year was the Bunnings BBQ. Thanks to Jack Hill and those who helped in the running of this activity.

Much of the club's success is also due to the work done behind the scenes by the Club committee. A special thank you to the Club Secretary, Michael Seton, and to all the committee, Steve Dinneen, Barbara Johnson, Angela Robbie, Graeme Olden, Natalia Kremenchutska, Michael Bodey, Nick Carah, Pia Hunter, Steve Kelly and Tony Rule for their contribution throughout the year. Thanks also to Grace Brown, Sarah Cant and Jack Hill, who have now stepped down from the committee but whose efforts are still much appreciated.

Summer Report 2015/16 Track and Field Season

Shield Competition

Box Hill had an extremely successful 2015/16 track and field season. We had eight teams competing in the Athletics Victoria shield competition this year. Of these eight teams, seven made it through to the shield finals. Of these seven teams, five of them finished in the top two in the finals, with our men's Open Division 1 and our women's over 40 team winning premierships.

Men Open Division 1

Women Open Division 1

Box Hill came agonizingly close to pulling off the men's and women's Division 1 double, with our women's team going down by one solitary point, 483 points to 482 points. This was the closest competition of the finals, with six teams all in with a chance of winning. Congratulations to all the athletes who competed so well in this team and let's hope we can go one better next year.

Men Over 40

Our men's over 40 team finished second again this year. Despite our best efforts we seem to keep falling just short in this division, but next year will be our year! Thanks to Andrew Wilcox for all his work and communications with the over 40 team this season.

Women Over 40

Our over 40 women's team successfully defended the title that they won last year, dominating their age group. Congratulations to Karen Carah, Amanda Harper, Pia Hunter, Kim Butler, Talitha Crawford, Julie Norney, Sharron Meager, Anna Di Medio and Kerry Putt, who all competed regularly throughout the season. Nearly all of our team competed in multiple events and there were some terrific performances on finals day.

Thanks to Amanda Harper for organizing this team throughout the season and making sure we had the best team possible qualified to compete in the finals.

Men Under 18

The under 18 men's team finished second in the shield finals and came extremely close to winning the premiership. This team was high on quality but low on numbers all season and it was an extremely good effort for this team of just eight boys to come so close to winning the premiership.

Women Under 18

Our under 18 women's team did well to finish in fourth place in the finals, not too far behind the leading teams. Unfortunately a couple of our top runners were unavailable for the finals but those who were there competed extremely well.

Men Under 16

Unfortunately our men's under 16 team failed to make the shield finals, but there were many good performances throughout the year and they finished a close third on the ladder in white zone.

Women Under 16

Our under 16 women's team finished fourth in the shield finals, despite having a number of athletes unavailable. Many of these girls will be under 16 again next year and it looks like we can do very well in this age group next season.

International Representatives

It is exciting to see four Box Hill athletes selected to represent Australia at the upcoming World Under 20 Championships. Georgia Hansen (800m), Sarah Billings (800m, 4x400m relay), Kathryn Brooks (javelin) and Nana Owusu-Afriyie (4x100m relay) will compete for Australia in Poland in July 2016.

We also had four athletes compete in the World Masters Games in Lyon, France in August 2015. Andrew Wilcox won a bronze medal in the men's 45-49, 400m event producing a time of 51.44s. Amanda Harper finished a very close 4th in the 2000m steeple in the 45-49 years division, Karen Carah finished 6th in the 45-49 years Heptathlon and Simon Evans finished 6th in the 55-59 years 5000m walk.

Winter report: XCR'15 Cross Country and Road Racing

Box Hill had many good results in the XCR'15 (cross country and road racing) season, but after our recent domination of the Athletics Victoria XCR competition, it proved to be a slightly disappointing year, with Box Hill winning just one premiership, in the men's over 50 division.

Our Premier Division men's team was weakened by injury and illness and the unavailability of many of our top runners who had helped us win the 2013 and 2014 titles. Nevertheless, a number of our younger runners stepped up and kept our team on top of the ladder for most of the season and only fell away in the last two of the ten events to finish 2nd this year.

Likewise, our women's Premier Division team slipped from 2nd in 2014 to 4th in 2015. Our women's over 40 team also failed to defend the title they won in 2014 and despite some great performances finished 2nd in 2015.

Our over 50 men's team, led by the indefatigable John Meagher, clearly won the premiership in its division, with good performances throughout the season from Peter Stefanos, Graeme Olden and Chris O'Connor.

There were also many outstanding individual performances.

Courtney Powell defended her national cross country title, won the state 10k road racing championship in a speedy 32 minutes 33 seconds and placed third in the Oceania road racing championships held in Launceston.

Steve Kelly won two silver and two bronze medals from the five XCR events he contested and finished 2nd overall in the Athletics Victoria winter champion competition.

John Meagher and June Petrie were crowned as AV winter champions in the men's and women's 50-54 years age group and Julie Norney was 2nd in the 45-49 age bracket (despite winning her age group in every event she entered!). Rhys Jones, our Adelaide resident member, travelled over to Melbourne and finished 2nd in the Victorian cross country championships at Bundoora.

Our junior results were restricted by the number of school commitments of our best cross country athletes, but there were a number of promising results, including Molly McCarthy who won the Victorian under 14 all schools cross country title and then finished 4th in the national championships. Laura Powell won a bronze medal in the under 17 all schools cross country as did Georgia Hansen in the under 18 event.
